Preserving the Quality of Life in Dollard-des-Ormeaux

## Adoption of the Urban Planning Program and the Zoning By-law

Dollard-des-Ormeaux, March 12, 2025 — At the city council meeting of March 11, 2025, the City of Dollard-des-Ormeaux adopted the new Urban Planning Program and the Zoning By-law designed to preserve the quality of life for which the city is renowned.

"I'm delighted to share that the municipal council supported and was unanimous on the Urban Planning Program and the Zoning By-law: the regulations presented, which have been adapted through the involvement of our community, truly reflect the collective public vision for the future of our City. This is a crucial step in protecting and preserving the integrity of our City and the quality of life that reflects us. This concludes five years of public reflection and consultation. The comments gathered during this process have made it possible to develop an Urban Planning Program and a Zoning By-law that reflect a shared vision for the preservation of 95% of the territory and its redevelopment, particularly along the main boulevards. Here are the highlights:

- Preserving the Marché de l'Ouest site as is, with a requirement that residents be involved in approving any future development of the site;
- Reducing allowable densities and heights for potential development sites, a request made by residents in April 2024, to promote mixed-use developments and human-scale planning.

## **Next regulatory steps**

Before officially becoming effective, the by-laws adopted by the city council must be approved in accordance with the Montréal Urban Agglomeration Land Use and Development Plan, and the zoning by-law must be approved by qualified voters. The latter procedure will be initiated by a public notice sent to the entire territory of Dollard-des-Ormeaux. The process is expected to take about five months.
